Brunarica Kosobrin is owned and run by Mojca Samotoran who is the perfect host. Her cosy little restaurant is warm and welcoming in winter and bright and breezy in summer. We were in the area as part of our skiing trip and having walked the short distance from the main town in the cold we were so pleased to be welcomed in to the lovely wooden cabin, log fire burning and her beautiful dog Bella collapsed under a table!



I've wanted to visit Slovenia for the longest time and we were having an amazing time in Kranjska Gora but halfway in to our trip I hadn't tasted any Slovenian food (apart from some cabbage from the supermarket that looked like sauerkraut and a woman I asked assured me it was delicious but to me it tasted salty and sour in one!). I dropped Mojca an email to ask if she had any vegetarian food and as she is vegetarian herself she was able to assure me she could make her traditional Slovenian stews without meat or animal stocks. And so it was that when ski lessons finished for the day we found ourselves walking along the quiet little road out of the town.

Brunarica Kosobrin feels like you are in Mojca's front room, it is such a cosy little place and very popular too with people coming and going all the time.



We started off with two Slovenian stews, one which was packed full of cabbage and beans and whilst interesting to try still had a slightly sour taste to our British taste buds.



We also has an absolutely delicious stew. Packed full of vegetables and ever-so-slightly spicy it was hot and warming and wonderful and the kids dug in too, dunking big chunks of bread in and finishing every last bit. It was perfect winter food and just perfect.

There were lots of other savoury dishes on the menu including cheese and meat plates and sandwiches but we wanted to try the traditional Slovenian food of the area and the stews were the perfect way to do this.

The children also demolished the thickest hot chocolates ever which they loved, our five-year old looked like a clown at the end with chocolate smeared across his face he enjoyed it so much.



And we finished the meal with some sweet treats. First some traditional dumplings filled with dried pear and polenta. These were really good, not too sweet but filling and satisfying. Mojca brought us some cinnamon to sprinkle across the top to add a little spice (and washed down with mulled wine for the grown ups was the perfect combination).



And finally we couldn't leave Slovenia without trying their traditional blueberry strudel which was so good and packed full of sweet blueberries.



We loved the surroundings of Brunarica Kosobrin, there's a ski slope out the back with a small button lift and Mojca has a lovely little yurt with fire blazing where you can sit a while and warm up in the winter.



We loved Brunarica Kosobrin, it really is the perfect little winter retreat and I imagine in summer it to be the loveliest place to sit and enjoy the warmer temperatures and wild flowers across the hillside.
